### Govt initiates action...

The GAD letter said that the information of category wise vacancies of district level, divisional level and state level under concerned department should be sent in excel on given e-mail and in hard copy by September 22.

### Rukun in Assembly...

However, in wake of 15 notices from the Opposition a discussion should take place first followed by the CM's reply. However, home minister Narosan Misra, PWD minister Gopal Bhagwani and Sanjay Singh, and State Minister of Agriculture and Cooperatives Prashant Kishore were present at the meeting after the CM's reply but the Opposition members were not ready to accept either the view of the treasury benches or the ruling of the Speaker.

In his statement the CM said, "The report which is being referred to as a CAM report is not a CAM report but a draft report prepared by the Accountant General. Prashant Kishore said the draft report of the Accountant General was for the period from 2016 to 2022 which includes 15 months of the then Congress government. He said out of the 64 chapters mentioned in the report, 30 pertained to the tenure of the Congress government. A vehicle with registration number JH05-HA-0111 used in transport was found to be of a motorbike. Similarly the registration number MP05-HA-0111 used in transport was found to be of that of cars. As per the report, he said, "In total of 114 days, more production than power consumption was reported. We will overcome these dirty tricks of the BJP," he said. His party colleague Pawan Khera echoed him and said the BJP targeted by the Bharat Jodo Yatra, had organised Operation Kichad (mud) in the coastal state. The BJP retained power in the coastal state after the state Assembly elections in February this year. It has 20 MLAs in the Assembly while the Congress' strength is 11. The 10 seats are yet to be filled.

The eight Congress MLAs - Rakesh, Michael Lobo, Delhalo Lebo, Rajesh Phadkai, Kedar Naik, Sharad Amritkar, Aleixo Soqueira and Rudolf Fernandes - were seen interacting with Somani in a viral photo hours ahead of formally joining the BJP.

Michael Lobo who joined the BJP took the decision to strengthen the ranks of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Somani, however, on the other hand, remains suspended in the Congress. Legislative Party meeting here to merge with the BJP, Lobo said. The three MLAs who did not switch sides - Yuri Alencar, Altino D'Costa and Carlson Alvares Ferreira - were not present at the meeting and said they would stay with the party.

The party is not dependent on MLAs. Congress will remain firm in the state now that the MLAs have joined. Aleixo said, "We are giving our word that we will be with the party and will remain strong. We are not some commodity that can be purchased." He added, stating that prior to the elections Congress candidates had taken an oath not to defect, Aleixo said, "I don't know how someone can defy God." Carlson Alvares Ferreira and the eight MLAs could not be said to have merged with the BJP. "If they have merged Congress into the BJP then which party we (three) belong to," he asked.

### Fire in AI plane's...

However, there was no fire warning indication in the cockpit. As a matter of precaution, and following the prescribed procedure, the crew stopped on taxiway and activated the aircraft emergency shutdown system, the statement said. Air India Express also said the matter is being investigated by the regulatory authorities as well as the airline's flight safety department. A senior official at the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said the regulator is probing the incident and appropriate action will be taken after the investigation is completed.

An Air India flight has arrived a relief flight to bring back guests from Pakistan. The Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) of Oman said there was fire in one of the engines of the aircraft. ### Former Chambal dacoit...

The former dacoit said he entered the boundaries of Chambal ravines as his paternal uncle usurped his family's land and whenever his father asked him to give him his share of the ancestral land and livestock, he always turned him away.

"After I grew up, I also requested my 'chacha' to give me my share of the land. But he never gave it to me. I also filed a police complaint against me. That was the flash point and I murdered him to take revenge and entered the Chambal ravines," Sikarwar said.

Till the time he surrendered in 1984, he was heading a gang of 30 dacoits. These members joined him as they had also faced injustice, he said.

Nearly 70-72 cases of murder and 15 to 20 cases of abductions were registered and solved in different police stations in 1984, he added. However, the call given by Gandhian activist Rajapal P V during the term of former state chief minister Arjun Singh, changed his life and he along with his gang members surrendered. They spent 10 years in Sabalsgarh jail in Moradabad district before being released, Sikarwar said.

Following his release from jail, he ensured that 200-300 tribal families got their rights back in different ways and therefore, they treat him like a messiah, he added.

Sikarwar said that he would continue to follow the Gandhian values and fight for the rights of the poor.

7 COPS SUSPENDED AFTER BIHAR MASS SHOOTING

PATNA: Seven police personnel in Bihar's Begusarai were suspended on Wednesday for the lapse in duty after two gunmen went on a rampage in the district, killing a man and critically injuring 11 people, a senior official said. Additional Inspector of Police (HOS) Anuraj Singh Gangwar said the police force had been told to stop the gunners who were suspended as they could not stop the two gunmen who went on a shooting spree in Begusarai on Tuesday. A hand is seen to rub the two gunmen, who are yet to be identified, he said. Those suspended were lower-rank police personnel, not above that of assistant sub-inspector (ASI).
